

God Gave Evangelists Pt. 2

May 23, 2019

Ephesians 4:11-12 ESV

11 And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers,
12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ.

EVANGELIST (euaggelistēs) a bringer of good tidings, heralds of salvation

- The Evangelist is similar to the Apostle in that they are both sent; but the Apostle's focus is planting and overseeing churches and the Evangelist's focus is proclaiming the good news of the Gospel.
- The Evangelist is similar to the Pastor in that they both care for souls; but the Pastor's focus is caring for the believer and the Church while the Evangelist's focus is caring for the unbeliever/lost.

Evangelism is to be in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Mark 16:15-18 ESV

15 And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.

16 Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.

17 And these signs (sēmeion - sign, mark, token, that by which a person is distinguished from others, unusual occurrence, transcending the common course of nature) will accompany those who believe: in my name they will cast out demons; they will speak in new tongues;

18 they will pick up serpents with their hands; and if they drink any deadly poison, it will not hurt them; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover."

Luke 10:17-20 ESV

17 The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!"

18 And he said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven.

19 Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall hurt you.

20 Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

- Jesus addresses a common problem with signs and wonders, which is the pride of man. We can misuse the power of God to draw attention ourselves and manipulate others.

Do signs and wonders convince people to believe?

- Signs and miracles are a great encouragement to those who believe and to those who are being drawn by the Holy Spirit.
- But to those who willfully and rebelliously refuse to believe, no miracle from God will convince them.
- Some seek signs and wonders for carnal reasons, for sensationalism. God works signs and wonders to minister to people in love and care.
- Satan can and will use signs and wonders to deceive, even the very elect if possible.

John 2:23 ESV

23 Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he was doing.

John 3:2 ESV

2 This man [Nicodemus] came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."

John 12:37 ESV

37 Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him.

Luke 16:31 ESV (Jesus' parable of Abraham's Bosom)

31 He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead.'

Acts 8:4-11 ESV

4 Now those who were scattered [persecution from the Jews led by Saul] went about preaching the word.

5 Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed to them the Christ.

6 And the crowds with one accord paid attention to what was being said by Philip when they heard him and saw the signs that he did.

7 For unclean spirits, crying out with a loud voice, came out of many who had them, and many who were paralyzed or lame were healed.

8 So there was much joy in that city.

9 But there was a man named Simon, who had previously practiced magic in the city and amazed the people of Samaria, saying that he himself was somebody great.

10 They all paid attention to him, from the least to the greatest, saying, "This man is the power of God that is called Great."

11 And they paid attention to him because for a long time he had amazed them with his magic.

2 Thessalonians 2:9-10 ESV

9 The coming of the lawless one is by the activity of Satan with all power and false signs and wonders,

10 and with all wicked deception for those who are perishing, because they refused to love the truth and so be saved.

Evangelism is fishing for those who are responding to the Heavenly Father's drawing.

Mark 1:16-17 ESV

16 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.

17 And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men."

John 6:44-45 ESV

44 No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day.

45 It is written in the Prophets, 'And they will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me--

The disappointment and discouragement of evangelism and pastoring - those who turn away.

- We will be tempted to twist and manipulate the message (to make it more appealing to the world) if we don't understand that:
 - Only those who are drawn by the Father can come.
 - There will be many who will fall away.

John 6:65-69 ESV

65 And he said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father."

66 After this many of his disciples turned back and no longer walked with him.

67 So Jesus said to the Twelve, "Do you want to go away as well?"

- We don't have a headcount; but the disciples who left were of the group of 72, not the 12.

68 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life,

69 and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God."

Will few be saved?

Luke 13:22 ESV

22 He went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying toward Jerusalem.

23 And someone said to him, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" And he said to them,

- What would have prompted this question?

24 "Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able.

25 When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then he will answer you, 'I do not know where you come from.'

26 Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.'

27 But he will say, 'I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!'

28 In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God but you yourselves cast out.

- There will be many that try to use religion for selfish gain, guilt, life improvement, Christian kindness.
- They like the concept and the message.
- But they can never surrender their will, their control and their lives to Jesus' lordship in a personal relationship of abiding in Him.
- The call to absolute surrender, denying self, taking up your cross, is what keeps many away and what causes many to fall away.

Mark 4:14-20 ESV

14 The sower sows the word.

15 And these are the ones along the path, where the word is sown: when they hear, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word that is sown in them.

16 And these are the ones sown on rocky ground: the ones who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with joy.

17 And they have no root in themselves, but endure for a while; then, when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately they fall away.

18 And others are the ones sown among thorns. They are those who hear the word,

19 but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches and the desires for other things enter in and choke the word, and it proves unfruitful.

20 But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold."

God's Sovereignty in Evangelism (Divine Appointments)

- We need to pray for God to so order our steps into "divine appointments!"

Acts 8:26-40 ESV

26 Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place.

27 And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship

28 and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah.

29 And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot."

30 So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"

31 And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him.

32 Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearers is silent, so he opens not his mouth.

33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."

34 And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?"

35 Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus.

36 And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?"

37

38 And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him.

39 And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing.

40 But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.
